The British Council Grand Banyan Project

SAI International School has always inculcated social values in the students and empathy for the lesser privileged children around them. Several projects are undertaken right from Joy of Giving to Environment saving initiatives.

In collaboration with the British Council the School is participating in the **biggest National paper recycling project –The Grand Banyan Tree Project and Design for Change** that will contribute towards saving the environment and helping a huge number of less advantaged children with notebooks made from recycled paper while providing walking sticks for visually impaired children.

The Grand Banyan Project is an initiative of the British Council which invites all the schools across India, to take part in one of the biggest paper recycling projects and contribute towards saving the environment.

Design for Change is the largest global movement designed to give children an opportunity to express their own ideas for a better world and put them into action. The collection of paper waste will be sold in order to raise funds that will be used to purchase walking sticks for our visually impaired friends. T-shirts Special designed by SAI students will be sold to buy dark glasses for the visually impaired children and staff members of the Bhima Bhoi School for the Blinds.

The students of the School are contributing paper waste at collection spots demarcated in the school (classrooms and recycling bins in the atrium) with all enthusiasm. The children have also learnt that Paper waste can be reused for better purpose and a cause that can change the lives of many children in need. This is also part of the community service agenda in the co-curricular activities.
